

Delighting in the Lord

Have you thought lately about how the Psalmist delighted in the Lord and His Word through the affliction and struggles that he went through? The Psalmist of chapter 119 had many persecutors and adversaries (v. 157) and he was persecuted at times without a cause (v. 161). Psalm 119 is great counseling when being afflicted for the Psalmists turns us to God and His Word. As believers, we ought to do the same, because God is our ultimate Counselor. "Your testimonies also are my delight and my counselors" (Psalm 119:24).

Another Psalm of delighting in the Lord is Psalm 37. Verse 4 "Delight thyself also in the Lord". Here we find peace and fulfillment in the Lord by trusting in Him (v.3) and committing one's way to the Lord (v. 5). When we take delight in the Lord and His Word, our hearts can truly find peace and fulfillment in Him. He is our "all in all".

It is God's blessing to believers to find true peace and comfort in God and His Word. We have, and will continue to face afflictions and troubles, more than we want. Will you turn to the Word of God to find true counsel that will give you peace, rest and assurance?

To find delight in the Lord is not superficial or a band aid. It is real and satisfying. Reading Psalms 37 and 119 can give a deep, satisfying peace with God when afflicted. The unsaved can not know nor experience what God has for His children as they are spiritually dead.

Afflictions come in various forms and ways. Too often they come from a seemingly trustworthy source, like friends and family. They come too frequently from health problems, financial stresses and relationship issues. God offers "the peace that passes all understanding" (Philippians 4:7) and He is the "God of all comfort" (2 Corinthians 1:3). Trust Him today with your needs and cares.
